


Our 3D club were busy all winter making beautiful things to sell at our Christmas Showcase.




As usual, the Burgate artists decorated the Burgate window to take the time to remember.





The Burgate School and Sixth Form have been transforming an empty shop window along Fordingbridge High Street into an engaging pop-up gallery, bringing creativity, colour, and conversation to the heart of the town.

This initiative has showcased a wide range of work across different year groups. Sixth Form artists kicked off the project with a live Easter-themed painting created in situ, allowing the public to see the creative process unfold in real time. This was followed by a large-scale collaborative installation for VE Day, featuring hand-drawn bunting by every Year 7 student. The design took inspiration from the bold, expressive work of Catalan artist Cristine Daura and celebrated themes of remembrance, community, and hope.


Coming up next, the high street will host a striking installation of painted doors, created by students in response to the work of African-American artist Betye Saar. Saar's influence—known for exploring identity, heritage, and storytelling through assemblage—offers a rich foundation for students to explore their own voices through mixed-media and symbolic imagery.

Each new display has captured the attention of local residents and visitors, many of whom have praised the students' creativity and the way the work brings new energy to otherwise unused spaces.

This ongoing project not only offers a platform for young artists to exhibit outside the classroom, but also gives them the chance to engage with real-world audiences and contribute meaningfully to their town's cultural landscape. Students are excited to have their work displayed in such a prominent position in the community and are proud to invite their friends and family to see their most recent artwork on show.

We hope this initiative inspires our students to see themselves as artists with a voice—and encourages others to engage with and celebrate the creativity of the next generation.


#### Little Things Make a Big Difference

Year 9 visited the river as part of their River of Hope exploration. River of Hope is an arts-based learning project linking schools around the world through the study of rivers and environmental issues. It aims to inspire young people through creativity whilst addressing key Climate Change and environmental issues. Our visit today was delivered by Matt West. Matthew is a poet, writer, educator and facilitator based in Southampton. Together we explored poetry, sounds and emotions and our young artists were encouraged to write a collaborative poem to express their concerns about global environmental issues through the spoken word and their observations of experiencing the river.

Returning from the river we were lucky enough to spend two days with Heidi Steller, making our flags! Heidi trained at Nottingham Trent University as a Theatre Designer and has an MA in printmaking from Camberwell College of Arts.

As a theatre designer she has worked on both small- and large-scale performance productions for the last 20 years. Heidi specialises in Outdoor Theatre, Celebratory Arts and Scenic Art. Her work includes large-scale sculptural pieces with outdoor arts company 'Emergency Exit Arts' for events such as the Thames Festival in London and as a designer and collaborator for outdoor theatre piece 'Cloudscapes' with Dorset based theatre company 'Gobbledegook Theatre'. Heidi runs art workshops in schools and community settings as well as working at AUB as a visiting tutor. At AUB she teaches Performance Design, drawing, model making, festival sculpture and scenic art. She also loves to collaborate with dance, exploring drawing and movement.


