Autumn Impact Statement




The following statement is a review of Pupil Premium funding at The Burgate School for Autumn 2019 and the impact which it has had in continuing to close the gap between Disadvantaged and Non Disadvantaged students. There are currently 123 Disadvantaged students in the main school and Sixth Form. A detailed breakdown of the impact of each area of spend for the academic year can be seen in the Pupil Premium Budget 2019/2020

Impact of PP spending on progress and continuing to close the gap.

Pupil Premium funding is used to close the gap between Disadvantaged students and their non Disadvantaged peers. The funding is used in a variety of ways which is detailed in the school's Pupil Premium budget available on our website. As demonstrated by our 2018/2019 examination results and by the in year tracking of students' progress demonstrated below Disadvantaged students are on track to reach expected progress in all year groups.

Head of Department and Heads of Year track student level detail to support those Disadvantaged students who may not be achieving in line with their expected progress and put in place appropriate interventions. Details of such interventions and the impact they have can be found in the Pupil Premium budget and Departmental and Pastoral improvement plans.

Impact of PP spending on Behaviour

As demonstrated below Disadvantaged students constitute a higher percentage of Fixed Term Exclusions than is in line with the school population which receive Pupil Premium funding. The benchmark for students is to achieve 50 House points in a term. Students should not accrue more than 10 behaviour marks in a term. The table below shows average House Points and Behaviour marks per student for the Autumn term.

Trips and visits.

Pupil Premium funding is used to ensure that Disadvantaged students are offered equity in terms of cultural and educational enrichment programmes. All staff are encouraged to ensure a representative percentage of students on a trip are disadvantaged. The students are tracked. As shown below disadvantaged students are represented consistent with the school overall percentage of 12%.
