Our year 10 artists responded visually to the pieces of creative writing.







### **The Burgate School Photography Competition 2023**


## Fordingbridge Lantern Parade Competition


As part of the town's Christmas light switch on, pupils from Burgate Art and Design department came up with a design (to be coloured in) with the theme of


"light"

The pupils from the Junior School were then able to colour in the design, which will be used to promote the parade.


















As part of our eco/sustainability content in the art and design curriculum, year 7 made poppies using plastic bottles for our Remembrance service while year 13 painted the front window.
