


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Drama Club

Debating Society in main school


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Debating Society


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Gardening club

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
Amnesty International


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National Essay

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
The Storytellers

Maximum 30 students, day to be decided.





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Tenner Challenge


Students will be provided with the opportunity to set up their own business.

Maths Inspiration is a national programme of interactive maths lecture shows for teenagers. They give 14-17 year olds a chance to experience the UK's most inspiring maths speakers presenting mathematics live in the context of exciting, real-world applications.

The Maths department attend live events in theatres or watch the shows online depending on logistics and circumstances at the time.

The Alan Turing Cryptography Competition is aimed at secondary school children in the UK up to Year 11 (England and Wales), S4 (Scotland), Year 12 (Northern Ireland). You don't need to be a computer whizz or a mathematical genius — you just need to keep your wits about you and be good at solving problems! The competition is organised by the Department of Mathematics at the University of Manchester.

Teams register and complete the problems on site each week with staff supervision.

Cryptographical techniques are used everywhere in modern everyday life. For example, Whatsapp and many similar programmes use encryption to prevent eavesdropping, many websites use encryption to process credit card payments securely, and banks use it so that people can safely do their internet banking at home



In the past in school we have celebrated by holding pi recitation competitions and eating cake.



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
Maths Challenge at various levels (Junior, Senior and Intermediate)

The Mathematical Challenges is a highly regarded national competition consisting of multiple-choice Challenges. These challenges are completed by various year groups in the school. It encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems.

The problems on the Senior Mathematical Challenge are **designed to make students think**. Most are **accessible**, yet still challenge those with more experience.

All students will receive a certificate of participation. To recognize the highest performers in the Challenge, we award participants Bronze, Silver and Gold certificates



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
Ritangle competition
