The Alan Turing Cryptography Competition is aimed at secondary school children in the UK up to Year 11 (England and Wales), S4 (Scotland), Year 12 (Northern Ireland). You don't need to be a computer whizz or a mathematical genius — you just need to keep your wits about you and be good at solving problems!

The competition is organised by the Department of Mathematics at the University of Manchester.

Teams register and complete the problems on site each week with staff supervision.

Cryptographical techniques are used everywhere in modern everyday life. For example, Whatsapp and many similar programmes use encryption to prevent eavesdropping, many websites use encryption to process credit card payments securely, and banks use it so that people can safely do their internet banking at home

It encourages **mathematical reasoning, precision of thought,** and **fluency** in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems.

The problems on the Senior Mathematical Challenge are **designed to make students think.** Most are **accessible,** yet still challenge those with more experience.

All students will receive a certificate of participation. To recognize the highest performers in the Challenge, we award participants Bronze, Silver and Gold certificates

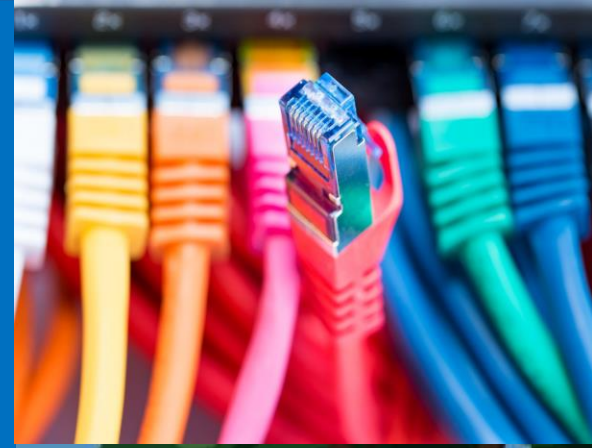
Ritangle is a competition designed for teams of students aged 16-18 who are currently studying A level Mathematics
