



2022 A Level Press Release, The Burgate Sixth Form:

Year 13 students from The Burgate Sixth Form received their A level examination results this morning and we are delighted to celebrate their achievements with them. Top grades at A* were a slight improvement on the teacher assessed grades given in 2021 and much higher than when examinations were last sat in 2019. Similarly, results A* to B were broadly in line with teacher assessed grades from the last two years and significantly higher than 2019. This means that the performance of Burgate students is above the national average once again. Over three quarters of our students have chosen to continue straight to university, where they will study a wide variety of courses ranging from Mathematics to Earth and Planetary Sciences, International Business to Architecture and Sport Performance Analysis to Graphic Design. Other students have chosen to undertake apprenticeships, to enter the job market or to take a gap year.
