SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS AND DISABILITY (SEND)

It is vitally important to us that any student with SEND who joins us has the **same opportunities to thrive and succeed** as any of our students. We work closely with our cluster schools to support the transition of students with SEND joining us in Year 7 in order to identify early their strengths and areas of need. Individual Learning Plans (ILPs) are written with students and parents to ensure that all staff are made aware of their individual needs and how they can best support them.

Our aim is to offer effective **high-quality teaching** as the first response to supporting a child with additional needs. We are an inclusive school with high expectations and believe that students make the most progress when they are in lessons with subject specialists guided by individual learning plans (ILPs). We aim to remove barriers to learning and encourage learners to be enthusiastic and passionate in the pursuit of excellence.

Our SEND provision is designed to ensure that each student has their best chance to **fulfil their social and academic potential**. Our adaptive teaching ethos enables every student to feel included in the learning environment.

We are committed to making our curriculum and extra-curricular activities accessible to all our students. We strive to make our school site and buildings user friendly with modifications where possible for our students, staff, and parents.

Our skilled team of **Learning Support Assistants** (LSAs) work collaboratively to promote group, paired and independent learning skills and help build resilient learners. Team Burgate means exactly that, we want you to feel part of our team.

THE BURGATE JOURNEY YEAR 7 AND 8

Secondary school **transition is seamless**. Our team support new students with visits to primary schools and invitations to parents and students to join us at school for various induction events as you navigate the move from primary school.

Over the first two years, they explore a **broad and ambitious curriculum** before choosing GCSE options towards the end of Year 8. The following subjects are studied across these first two years:

- English • Mathematics • Science • Geography • History • Religious Studies • Computing • French • Spanish • Music • PE • Art • 3D Design • Textiles • Food and Nutrition • PSHE





THE BURGATE JOURNEY YEAR 9, 10 AND 11

At this point in the Burgate journey we introduce our comprehensive three-year programme of study. This is a balanced and **tailored curriculum** to suit the needs of all our students. Every student will study the core subjects of English Language, English Literature, Mathematics and Science. Additionally, most of our students follow an 'expected pathway' studying Geography or History, a language, and two other GCSEs options of their choice. Students can choose to study separate Sciences (Biology, Chemistry and Physics) and Computer Science. We also offer a range of creative and **practical GCSEs** and equivalent vocational qualifications including, Art, Business, 3D Design, Hospitality and Catering, Media, Textiles, Philosophy and Ethics (RE), Photography, Drama, Music and PE.

In Year 9 the emphasis is on transition to GCSEs; throughout this year teaching enables students to develop deeper knowledge and understanding of their chosen subjects through 'exploration' projects which offer breadth beyond the exam specifications, allowing for more enrichment opportunities and thereby increasing students' cultural capital.

All Year 9, 10 and 11 students have an enrichment slot in their timetable. On a termly rotation students participate in Art and Cookery lessons, and they learn wider aspects of Geography and History that are not taught in the GCSE syllabus. The enrichment lessons also incorporate careers, citizenship, and financial wellbeing.

THE BURGATE JOURNEY YEAR 12 AND 13

For most of our students, our Sixth Form is the natural progression to capitalise further on the successes and achievements they will have cultivated in the main school and relationships they will have fostered with peers and staff. As such, we ensure the move is smooth and exciting, with plenty of opportunities to get a **'taste' of sixth form life** before starting Year 12.

Where new students join The Burgate at this stage they are welcomed into our community and quickly integrate into 'Burgate Life' supported by staff who are committed to ensuring they, like all our students, reach new heights and excel academically and emotionally.

Engaging projects, collaborative initiatives, sports, creative activities, life-skills, and leadership opportunities as well as **careers support** through application writing, work experience, industry expert talks and trips, all form part of the holistic learning we provide to raise aspirations of all our students. We believe young people cannot be what they cannot see.

We offer a wide variety of A Levels and some Level 3 courses, that enable students to fulfil university, apprenticeship, and career aspirations. Alongside this, students can also study EPQ, TEFL and Core English and Maths qualifications, with diverse enrichment activities also forming part of their timetable and laying a robust foundation for their future endeavours.

BURGATE AND BEYOND

Our students achieved another set of fantastic results in 2024, further strengthening our year-on-year performance and maintaining outcomes rated above national. It is always sad to see our students go at the end of their studies with us but wonderful to see how they set out on their next chapter in life, be it education or work:

- 61%** went to university (including Oxbridge, Russell Group & abroad)
- 11%** secured an apprenticeship, including degree apprenticeships.
- 15%** secured employment
- 9%** took a gap year (including those with deferred university placements)
- Plus **3%** joined the armed forces.

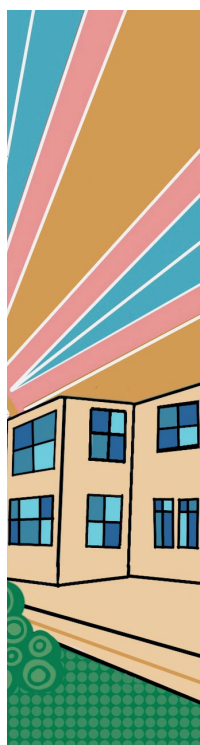
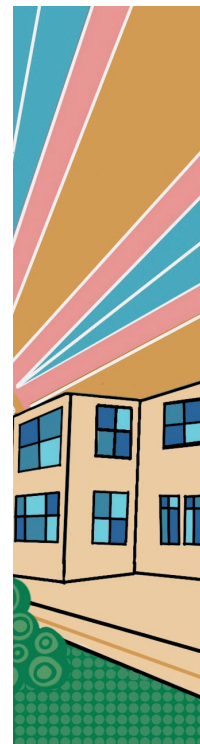
Team Burgate

RESULTS AND PROGRESS FOR ALL

Our results have gone from strength-to-strength at the school, and we are extremely proud of how well our students perform. Both boys and girls progress are **above the national average**. Our disadvantaged learners outperform their national peers as do our SEND students.

Academic results remain high and well above the national average including in English and Maths. The percentage of students successfully completing the English Baccalaureate (Grade 4 or above in English, Maths, Science, History/Geography, and a Language) is significantly above national and continues to grow year-on-year. These remarkable results are achieved through excellent teaching and learning. We have high expectations for all, and our dedicated specialist teaching staff offer high-quality qualifications. Our teachers strive for every child to achieve his or her **potential** through a five-year journey from Year 7 to Year 11 which builds skills and subject-specific knowledge over time.

Our achievements continue in our Sixth Form, where our provision is outstanding. The curriculum subjects that students choose post-16 are varied, **challenging, and engaging**. These subjects, delivered by subject specialists, allow each student to fulfil their potential and subsequently enable them to go on to the university or apprenticeship scheme of their choice. A number of students annually continue onto Russell Group universities after completing their A-Levels with us.

Extracurricular Opportunities

Many trips and visits arise naturally from our curriculum intent and enrich learning for students. Each year trips, and other educational activities are organised locally and further afield to provide opportunities that complement and further improve the whole school experience.

Trips enable students to make memories and build stronger friendships, by working with new people and experiencing new things together. #curiosity

Every student has the opportunity to take part. Examples of extracurricular opportunities include residential trips to Paris, Nice, Berlin, Malaga and the snowy tips of the Alps in Italy. At home trips and visits have included trips to the Tate in London, the New Forest, the local water park, local football and cricket grounds and other sites of natural and scientific interest. The possibilities are endless.

Beyond timetabled lessons, we offer numerous inclusive in-school activities and clubs for our students, and we actively encourage and expect every student to get involved in something.

There are regular sports practices and fixtures from netball to golf and rugby, including a weekly football academy for boys and girls. Our students also benefit from our new 3G Artificial Grass Pitch which provides an incredible sports training and playing facility. Our musicians meet each week for various bands, ensembles, and choirs and students can also engage in individual instrumental and vocal lessons. Budding actors can participate in our school productions and those who enjoy the outdoors can get involved in the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme. The Art and Design department offers numerous clubs and showcases the work of our students not only in school but also in the local area including our annual Creative Arts Evening in July.

Team Burgate and the Community

Community spirit is valued greatly at The Burgate and our Student Leadership Team and Eco Team play a key role here. Additionally, our sixth formers offer great support to our main school students through homework club, tutoring and mentoring.

Our student voice is led in sixth form by ambassadors that support subjects and various other student leadership roles. We encourage all our students to take an active role in our school community and empower them to get involved in student led initiatives.

LET THEM SHINE

At The Burgate we want all our students to be curious and ambitious learners. On entry to the school in Year 7 we teach predominantly in mixed ability groups with one higher ability class on each side of the year group. In this way we aim to **maximise the academic potential** of every student. Additionally, we have a dedicated 'aim higher' team to mentor students and to help guide them successfully on their chosen pathways to their **best possible university** and career destinations.

A variety of opportunities are available to all students which include participating in **national competitions** such as 'Debating Matters,' 'Write for Rights' (Amnesty International) and the Junior Kangaroo and Pink Kangaroo Maths challenge. We also embrace many sporting and STEAM opportunities and work alongside Southampton and Bournemouth University and Arts University Bournemouth.

Additionally, our students can take the **Higher Project Qualification** in Year 10 and the Extended Project Qualification in the Sixth Form

We encourage parents and students to share with us their successes outside of school. Team Burgate is proud to have international, national, and regional champions in karate, archery, swimming and motocross to mention but a few, in our midst.



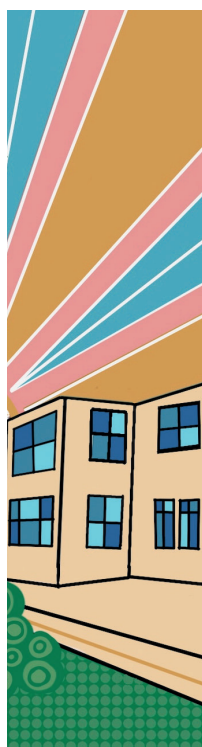
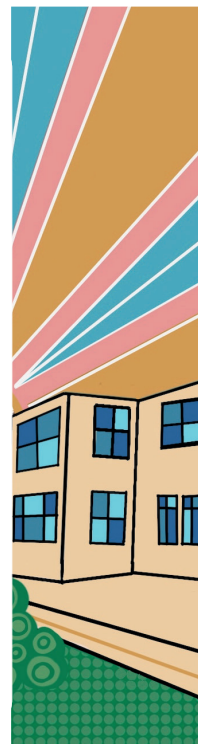

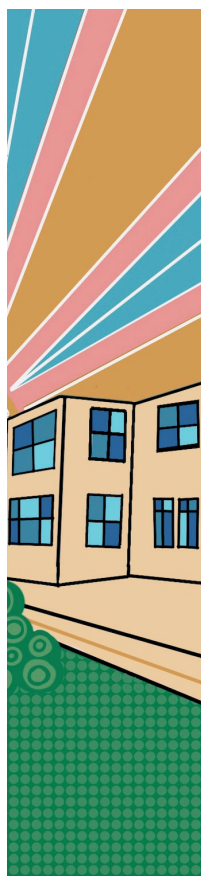


Charlotte - Burgate

BILLY SHERING

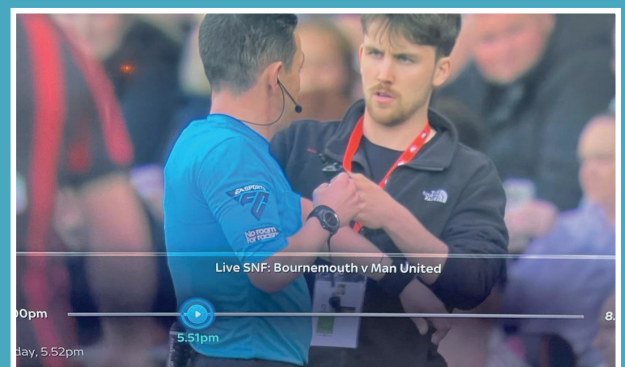

HOW TO JOIN US

We hope that from what you have read within our prospectus that you would like to be part of our school. If you haven't already had an opportunity to [visit us](#), then there are several events throughout the year that we hope you will be able to come to, or if you can't make one of the open events then we will be very happy to arrange a tour at another time.

The decision making process for secondary school often begins in Year 5 and we offer an opportunity for pupils to spend a day with us on one of several [Taster Days](#) organised in the Summer Term. Each September, to further aid the decision-making process for Year 6 parents and students, we also organise [tours of the school](#).

[Applications for Year 7 places](#) must be submitted through the local education authority within which you live. If you live in a different county to our school, you can still put us as your [first choice](#) if you would like to, but your local education authority will process the application. Applications for Year 7 places must be submitted to your local education authority by the end of October. At the beginning of March [places are allocated](#) by the local education authority and parents are informed of the outcome of their application. From there, those successful at securing a place with us will receive a welcome letter and will begin a comprehensive induction process as we ensure a happy transition for each child.

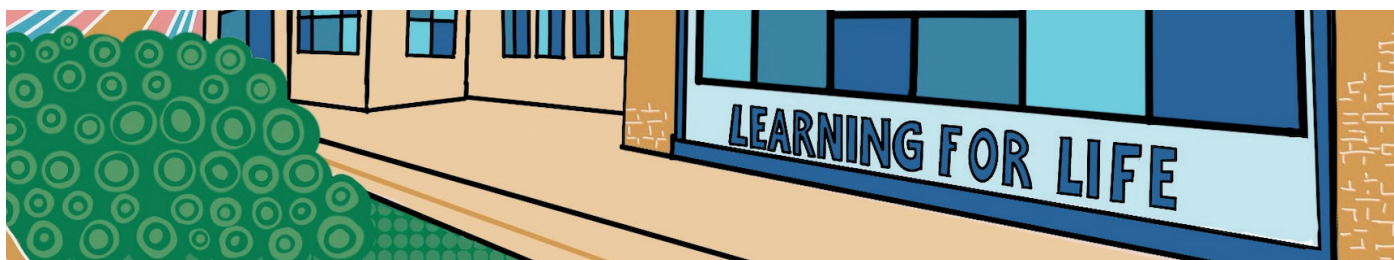
The Burgate School has over [25 feeder schools](#) ranging far and wide across Hampshire, Dorset, and Wiltshire. Sometimes a pupil might be the only one coming from their primary school which may make them apprehensive about starting at 'big school'. We are very experienced at supporting all our new students who quickly find their place in [the Burgate family](#). For those particularly uncertain or anxious about the move to secondary school, our Headstart programme and coffee mornings/afternoons in the Summer Term of Year 6 alleviate these fears through fun group activities, tours of the school and opportunities to meet other new students and key staff. All students involved say that it has a [positive effect](#) and that they feel much more confident about starting in September as a result!

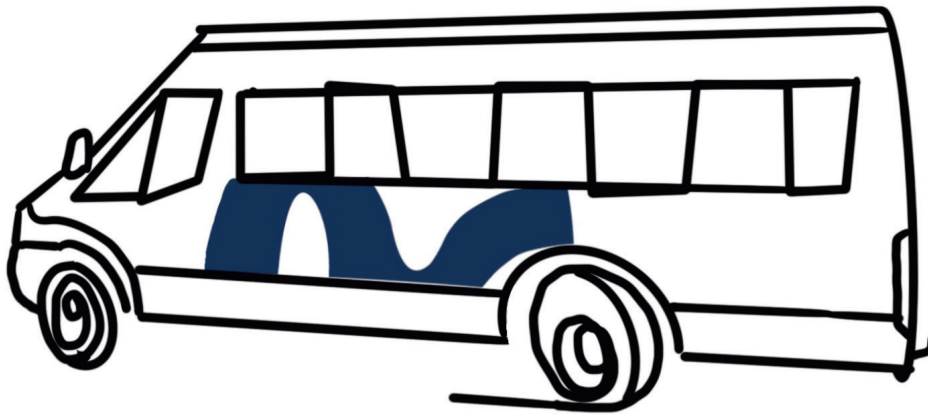

TRAVEL

We have a **comprehensive bus network** servicing our school and sixth form. Our location at the edge of the New Forest, on the A338 between Salisbury and Ringwood means that we have students joining us from across the area.

Our **dedicated school buses** serve many parts of Salisbury and the surrounding villages as well as Fordingbridge and its surrounding villages. Students living within our **transport catchment area** may be entitled to **free school transport** and should contact the Hampshire School Transport team or Dorset School Transport team to confirm this and to apply for passes. Students living outside of our transport catchment area will need to purchase tickets and details of the different routes, service providers and where to purchase tickets may be found on our website. **Students 16 years and over** are not eligible for free school transport once they have finished Year 11.

Students moving from Year 6 to Year 7 in September should complete online transport applications via either Hampshire County Transport or Dorset County Transport by the end of May preceding their start in secondary school to ensure that transport is organised for the first day of term.

School minibus routes are subject to viability each year and possible route changes. These are special services and not open to general applicants moving from Year 6 to Year 7 or general in-year applicants.

Enquiries about a seat on any of our minibus routes must be made directly to the school before the end of June each year. The outcome of any new minibus application received by this point will be confirmed in writing before the end of the Summer Term. The outcome of any application received after this point may not be confirmed until the start of the next academic year.

School Travel Entitlement and Privilege Passes- If you believe your child is entitled to free school transport to The Burgate please contact the appropriate transport team within the county that you live. 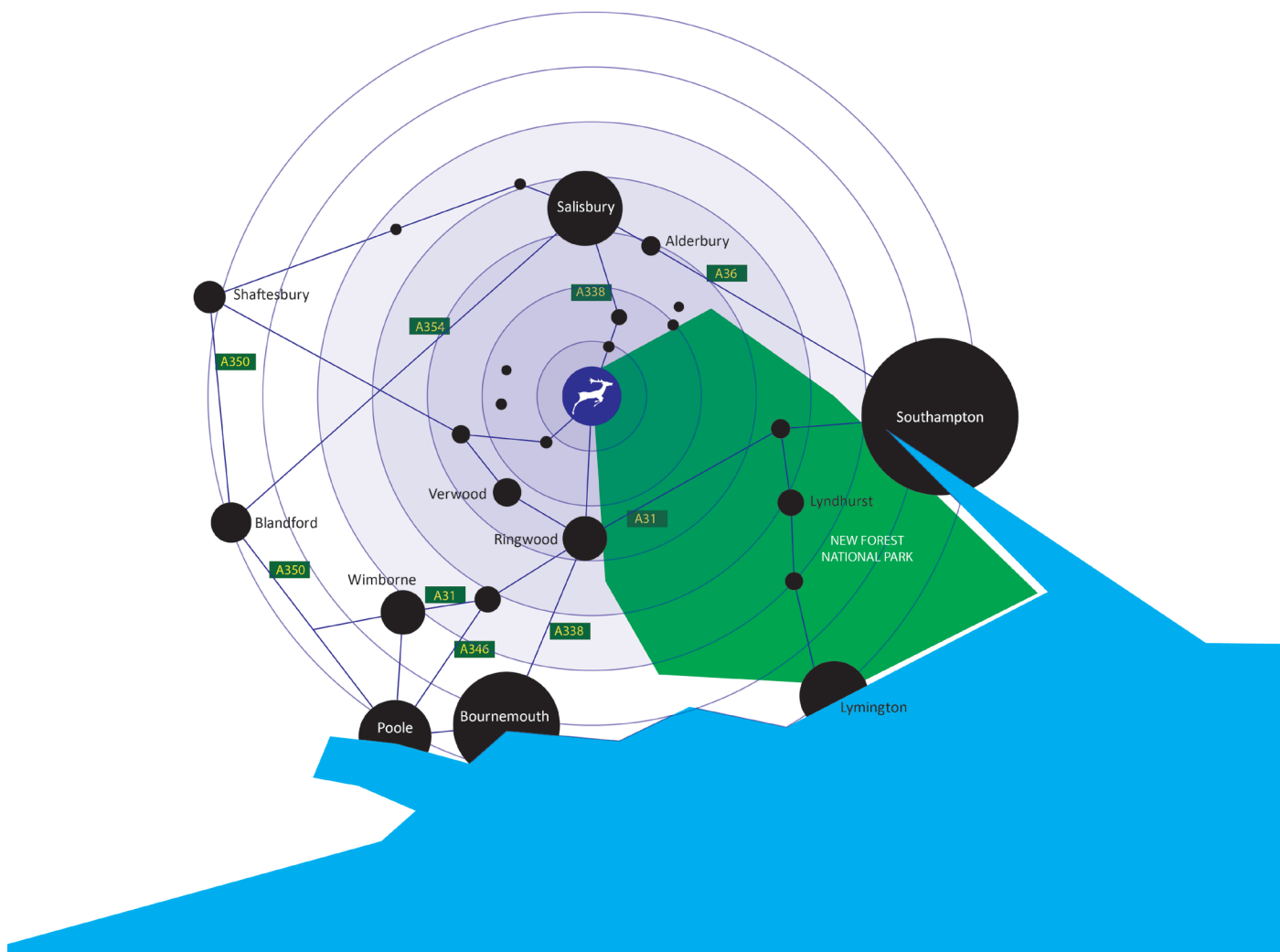
