The atmosphere around the school has been resoundingly positive and I have been pleased with the engagement of our students. Year 7 and Year 12 students have made particularly impressive starts.

The highlights from this term are in photographic form below and include: our Eco-sustainability school fence project, the Year 13 Clothing Challenge 'Recycle, Reuse', Year 10 students' workshop with the local PCSO, producing a training video on myths around what police can and cannot do with regards to anti-social behaviour in the community. Our Christmas showcase was a truly spectacular evening with performances from a wide range of musical and singing talent across the whole school, including staff. We were entertained by our rising stars in Year 7 to our accomplished performers from our Sixth Form. One performance that really shone out was the flute recital by our Year 13 student, Eloise Gill, who has also recently added a Grade 8 Distinction to her impressive CV.

We are continuing to work in partnership with the local community and welcomed the opportunity to attend the official opening of the Community Orchard in Fordingbridge and to design the lanterns for the Christmas lights parade. Trips and visits this term have included a visit to Cranborne Chase (students made visual art with creative writing inspired by the day) and a GCSE trip to Malaga in Spain. The Drama and English Departments welcomed AUB Bournemouth to perform Macbeth at the school, which was highly entertaining.

We have introduced our 'Sports Report' where you can read about the many individual and team successes, which we are rightly very proud of and recommend you follow us on Instagram. Team Burgate goes from strength to strength as seen in the inaugural Sixth Form Burgate 7s Netball and Rugby tournament, our Burgate showjumpers who competed at Dauntsey's School, Daisy who was selected for the DWAA (Dorset and Wiltshire Archery Association) and Tom who achieved world number one in the 14-16 category for Kata at the World Karate Federation in Paris. A huge well done to everyone involved.

At the start of this term, I wrote to you about the significant building projects at the school: new 3G artificial grass pitch (AGP) as well as complete rewiring/new fire safety system. I am pleased to report that, despite the weather, both projects are progressing well. Contractors have completed the rewiring of the Science Block and will move to the Music rooms after Christmas.

## **News from the Chair of Trustees**

On behalf of the Trustees, I extend a very sincere and heartfelt thanks to the staff of the Burgate and Sixth Form, both teaching and non-teaching, whose hard work and dedication is never in question, and to the parents, carers and students, without whom our school would not be what it is today.

The vision for the Burgate School and Sixth Form is that we want every student to enjoy their learning and to feel valued for who they are. It encompasses the idea that every child matters and that we can inspire them by helping to provide a learning environment where they are happy. We are always looking to the future, and it is something that everyone working in the school is aiming for by enshrining the school's vision and values in the day-to-day workings and activities of the school. The school motto of 'Learning for Life' summarises in three words what the school is about.

The Trustees are no exception and strive for that shared objective. The work of the Board of Trustees has been full and varied this year continuing the work on whether we should connect more formally with other local schools to become a Multi-Academy Trust instead of a Single Academy Trust which we still are. We will continue to explore becoming/joining a Multi-Academy Trust but it is important to the Trustees that any changes to the legal structure of the school will only take place if there is a clear and obvious benefit for the students and we will naturally keep you informed of the situation and consult with you before a final decision is made. Schools locally who have explored forming a Multi-Academy Trust, including Burgate, have formed a partnership called West Forest Forum to collaborate on approaches to teaching and learning, peer reviews and subject network meetings.

At our most recent Full Trustee Board meeting we approved the annual report and accounts, and we are fortunate to be able to continue to report that the school's finances continue to be in good shape. There are major projects taking place with extensive electrical work being done throughout the buildings and a new all-weather football pitch being laid.

The priorities we set for the Board for the coming year were:

to prepare for Ofsted

to continue to explore the possible joining of a Multi-Academy Trust, and to increase stakeholder engagement.

On this last point we are introducing a new format for the School's Annual General Meeting (AGM) this year. The AGM will take place on 30 January 2024 at 5.30pm in the Main School Hall – please come along. In addition, we will be publishing the minutes of the trustee meetings on the school website to help you see what the trustees are doing – keep an eye out for them!

The school continues to focus on its curriculum enrichment with a multitude of events and activities taking place beyond the classroom. In the Sixth Form, Amnesty International, the Ritangle Competition and Debating Matters continue to be popular and art, photography, drama and music continue to thrive as does a wide variety of sports and the Duke of Edinburgh scheme. Trips and visits are always popular with France, Italy, Spain and Germany featuring on the international travel agenda as well as many trips in and around the UK.

On behalf of the Board, I wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a happy, peaceful and prosperous 2024.

## **Sports Report – Autumn Term 2023**

The boys football season is drawing to a close with the weather hampering a lot of the fixtures. The leagues have yet to be finalised but the U16's are currently in 3rd position with Year 8 finishing as runners up for the 2nd year in a row. Year 9 have finished 4th in their league whilst Year 7 have been less successful but no less enthusiastic!

The girls football season has yet to get underway in terms of the New Forest leagues, but numbers to after school club is growing and we took Year 8 and Year 10 teams to Testwood School for 6 a-side tournament in September. The Year 10 team finished in 4th place whilst the Year 8 team were unbeaten when the tournament was abandoned due to a prolonged thunder and lightning storm; I am sure they would have won.

The netball season is similar to the football in that there are a few outstanding results needed from other schools; but the Year 7 & 8 teams are steadily improving and enjoying the competition. The Year 9 team have finished in 3rd place in their league and the U16s are the New Forest champions because they have not been beaten all season.

The cross-country season is well underway. We had some brilliant students who stood in at the last minute to race in the 1st round of the national cross-country cup, even though they were not the fastest Burgate runners. Unfortunately, they didn't qualify for the regional final but did well against a predominantly private school opposition. The New Forest Championships was postponed due to extremely wet weather and took place a week later in difficult conditions. The two best teams were the Year 8 & 9 boys who finished in 2nd place, and the Year 10 & 11 boys who went one better by winning their event. We had some fantastic performances in awfully cold and wet weather with a number of students qualifying for the county championships in the new year. Special mention to Charlie Coles for medalling in the inter-boys race at the end of the day.

Our sixth form sporting calendar has grown this year with the U18 Boys Dorset Football leagues well underway, The Girls Netball Team have also had a strong opening to their season with some dominating wins over Ferndown and Ringwood schools.

Mrs Newson Smith put together an inspiring new 7's festival combining rugby and netball as Burgate played host to a number of local sixth form colleges for an afternoon of friendly rivalry. The Burgate Netballers were narrowly beaten into 2nd place with the Boys Rugby team finishing in 3rd place. The Year 11 Sports studies class spent an exciting afternoon at Avon Tyrrell taking part in mountain biking and high ropes activities as part of their outdoor activities coursework. Much fun was had by all.

In September the entire Year 7 and Year 8 boys cohort spent several hours with a team of coaches from Fordingbridge Rugby Club to promote the sport and raise levels of participation. This was well received by the students who thoroughly enjoyed themselves and by the coaching team who identified a number of potential new players who then went on to try out the club sessions the following Sunday morning at Fordingbridge Rec. So, all in all a very positive outcome.




Our Year 9 netball team started the season well and began using all they had learnt during training sessions to develop a great team dynamic.

positions throughout the match to develop a variety of playing combinations. Special mention should go to Bella, player of the match.





Burgate went out hard from the start, leading the match throughout. We came away with an impressive 19-11 victory. Well done girls, for your enthusiasm and commitment.



Speakers included Jeremy Corbyn, Sir Ed Davies and Sir Jacob Rees-Mogg. All gave short speeches and then opened the floor to a question and answer session, which needless to say, became quite direct and fiery at times. Our students relished the opportunity to discuss, debate and engage with the wide range of political issues including UK foreign policy, the cost of living crisis and predictions for the next general election.

Year 12 Sociologists were inspired by a visit to London and the words of top academics and professionals at a recent Sociology in Action Conference.

It was amazing for them to see world famous Professor Ann Oakley unpick gender, Professor Jason Arday explore racism and Intersectionality, and to be challenged to use their sociological skills to make a difference by Dexter Dias KC.



Burgate social scientists also recently attended a packed two day trip to London, taking the Jack the Ripper tour to improve their offender profiling skills and explore the social conditions of the time. After a hostel stay in the East End they were fascinated by professionals, academics and ex-offenders during a conference. They found out how bad we are at spotting liars (except Henry), explored gendered patterns of crime and a variety of factors leading to offending from both an academic and personal viewpoint.
