The Burgate School Day

Our timetable runs in a two-week cycle which we call, week 1 and week 2. Student timetables on the <u>SIMS Parent App</u> will indicate which week it is. You will be sent login details for this at the start of the academic year.

We have 5 teaching lessons each day as well as a 15-minute registration and a 30-minute tutor lesson each day. There is a 15 minute break in the morning and 30 minute lunch.

The way the day starts is crucial, it sets us up for the day ahead. Each morning students meet with their tutor group and tutor for registration and notices before heading off to the first lesson of the day. The tutor group meet again in the middle of the day for a Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) session, group activities 1:1 mentoring and much more.

For a student to reach their full potential, both academically and socially, a high level of school attendance is essential. Statistics show that there is a direct link between underachievement and attendance below 95%. Homework for students

Homework enhances the teaching and learning within school and is an excellent way of fostering independent learning.

Homework tasks are set on Microsoft Teams.

Homework does not have to be a written task. It can be a 'thinking' task, an on-line exercise, research or pure learning. Teachers use the work completed at home and give feedback to the students, either by marking the work, setting a quiz/test or through discussion/feedback depending on the nature of the task. There are three main types of homework:

- Revision for a test/exam
- Demonstrating learning (deliberate practice)
- Consolidation

Feedback on homework is an opportunity for Strength, Improvement, Response (SIR) marking, peer or self-marking. The 'R' in SIR is crucial to success; students will be given the opportunity/time to respond to the suggested improvements (in green pen) during a lesson.

Parents role in homework is to provide a quiet space for their child to work and to build supportive routines.

We have an excellent reputation for the pastoral care we offer. We place real and significant importance on ensuring we create a learning environment that is safe and encouraging as well as exciting and challenging. Our wellbeing team, includes highly qualified, experienced, and specialist members who work collaboratively with our young people, and, where appropriate, their friends and family, to support their everyday emotional needs.

We recognise that at various points in a young person's life, sometimes more specialist and targeted support is needed, for lots of different reasons. Our Wellbeing Team offer a range of strategies and bespoke support, including well established links with external and independent charities and agencies.

The wellbeing team, led by Mrs Heidi Shering (Deputy Headteacher and Designated Safeguarding Lead – DSL). We have an in-school counsellor who provides confidential and individual support to our young people and can help address self-esteem and low mood as well as encourage sound self-help and long-term coping strategies. We also have a youth support worker from the Salvation Army, who regularly comes to school and meets with individuals and groups of students.



Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)

Our aim is to offer effective, high quality SEND support to enable students to access learning that is beneficial to their personal enrichment and future economic wellbeing.

We aim to remove barriers to learning and

allow students to be enthusiastic about their education and to have high expectations in the pursuit of excellence.

Through our inclusive classroom approach, our experienced team of learning support assistants (LSAs) work alongside subject teachers in classrooms to support students in making good progress. We work together in partnership — school/home/child, to create individual learning plans to ensure we are working towards shared goals and aspirations. Parents are equal partners in decisions about their child's education. We keep parents informed of their child's needs and progress and actively encourage the continuation of these conversations at home.

Piercings

Only a single pair of gold or silver studs may be worn in the lobe of each ear. All other piercings are not acceptable. Use of ICT Systems

We expect our students to respect the opportunities to use technology within their learning. This extends to all use of Microsoft products and equipment. Office 365 is the main login our students will need throughout their school career. Through this portal students can access all Microsoft applications including Word, Teams, PowerPoint and much more. All homework is set through this system.

Student ICT logins will be organised during the first few weeks of term.

We use Sims Parent App and Sims Student App. Both allow the account holder to see attendance, behaviour, recognition points and timetables. Parents will be sent a link to set this up during the first few weeks of term.


Enrichment and Extra-Curricular Activities

Travel

Please take some time to look at our safe and smart tips for travelling to The Burgate as well as the Hampshire Road Safety Newsletter designed for students and secondary school transition.

On Foot	Students can gain access to the site via the back student gate, side gate and front gate. Side and back gates are locked by 08:40 so please ensure that your child is in school on time.
Cycle	A growing number of our students cycle or scooter to school. We have a secure and covered bicycle rack by the tennis courts where students can lock their items. We would advise that all students undertake their road safety/cycling proficiency course to ensure they are road aware. All students cycling or scootering to school must have a permit from their Head of Year and always must wear a helmet.
By Car	Parents may collect or drop-off their child at school by using the drop off zones at the front of school. Our main school road is also a bus lane and so we ask that you please use the designated drop off zones only. With the exception of our disability access parking space parents are asked not to park inside the school gates.
By Bus	Please check our school travel page for information and bus timetables, ticketing and routes. Students should arrive at bus stops 5-10 minutes prior to the published collection times. It is very rare but sometimes due to traffic buses may on occasion be delayed - as soon as the school is aware of any issues we will send an email school comms message to parents to update them. If you believe your child may be eligible for free school bus transport you will need to apply directly to your local school transport team by 1 July to ensure that transport is organised in time for the beginning of the school term.

Transport Support for Families with three or more children:

For families with three or more Children studying with us (Year 7 - 13) we may be able to offer a financial contribution to bus passes up to £500 pa.
